RE: Required Reading for Permanent Mobility

The Law Society of the Northwest Territories recognizes that the Territorial Mobility Agreement [TMA] forms part of the National Mobility Agreement, thereby enabling Members of other signatory jurisdictions who are eligible to be admitted as permanent members of the Law Society of the Northwest Territories without writing the Statutes and Rules examination.

Therefore, the Executive of the Law Society of the Northwest Territories implements the attached reading requirements for those applicants applying for membership under the TMA. The *Required Reading for Permanent Mobility* list and accompanying Statutory Declaration forms part of the Membership Application Package. It will be updated as required.
